We are still working toward that goal. We are making progress!!



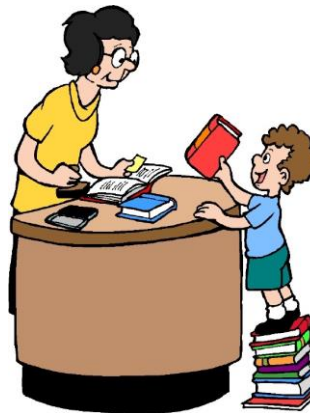
Why Do We Need a New Building??

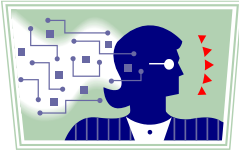
